Mukund R Thatte Immediate Past President ISSH We explore the environment around us with our outstretched hands. They serve as eyes to the visually impaired persons. If hand is injured, deformed or paralyzed by any of the disease process or trauma, the overall functionality of the individual is impaired. The person as a socially and economically productive contributor to the family is lost thereby. In an adult, the functional hands are essential to earn a livelihood. Therefore so much focus is laid on the hand, that it has become a specialty in itself.



Many common conditions affecting the hand which need proper attention such as part preservation after the amputation of finger, hand, forearm, arm still needs a lot of emphasis to the public at a grass root level so as to bring the part to the healthcare facility where it would be in a

condition amenable for reimplant. After sustaining injury to the hand or brachial plexus the need to refer to the hand surgery facility in time is very much lacking even in today's era of information revolution. An awareness campaign through leaflets, posters, public lectures, newspapers, FM radio, Televisions, social media, circulations of video clips with live demonstrations at public places like waiting area of bus stand, railway station, airport or even waiting areas of OPD of the hospitals would really help us in the long run.

There are so many conditions known in medical parlance where the hand and the upper extremity as a whole get affected. Each of the conditions needs proper attention to meticulous details to give proper justice to the art and science of solving it so as to make the person a useful and productive member of the society. That is the importance of trained manpower across the country with uniform standards of teaching in Indian context. We have crossed fifty golden years as a society of hand surgery in India ever since its inception in 1973. It is high time to ponder over what we have achieved so far and how far we will march fast in future. So it has been decided to train the trainers as a golden jubilee year initiative proposed by our president and endorsed by our society.

It is high time to raise awareness among the public and fellow treating fraternity, policy makers that the specialty needs attention. There are many programmes at government level like cancer prevention, burns prevention, anemia control, programme related to mental health, maternal and child health, but no such programme related to hand at national level. I would appeal all to seriously considering compiling an Indian text book of hand surgery involving a panel of experienced specialists which will serve as a reference material for the students, teachers as well as trainees for times to come. Though all these conditions are discussed thread and bare in different symposia, conferences, meetings and for a, a written published document serves as a blue book for eternity.

National Hand Surgery Day



On 23rd August. 2023 National Hand Surgery Day was celebrated by all ISSH members. On this day, several hand surgery camps, awareness programs about hand surgery, and educational activities were conducted by all ISSH members



Dr. R. Subashini, Associate Prof, Dept of Hand Surgery, SRIHER, Porur, Chennai organized a camp to see Outpatients with Hand problems. She with her team also distributed a pamphlet on how to avoid finger injuries due to the mixie grinder.



Dr Prashant Pradhan & and his team celebrated Hand Surgery Day with an educational talk on "first aid in hand injuries" in IOCL (Indian Oil Corporation Limited) hospital located in Digboi, Tinsukia, Assam

The talk was well attended by all emergency Medical Officers, nurses, and paramedical staff who manage the Emergency department around the clock. he also had an interactive session in which he educated them about the

- 1. Different types and mechanisms of Hand injuries and preventive measures.
- 2. Transportation of amputated fingers.
- 3. First Aid Management of Hand Injuries.
- 4. Definitive treatments and prognosis in hand injuries.

The talk was followed by a demonstration on splinting the hand in a functional position and suturing technique for tendon injuries. Being a Refinery hospital, hand injuries are quite common in the setup and it is very much necessary that the first aid providers are well-versed in related knowledge.



The **Department** of hand surgery at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal, observed Hand Surgery Day on August 23, 2023. A collection of informative posters pertaining to various aspects of hand surgery were prominently exhibited within our outpatient department. These posters covered topics such as first aid procedures specific hand surgery, to guidelines outlining recommended practices and precautions, as well as an overview of often encountered challenging disorders in hand surgery, including carpal tunnel syndrome, dequervain tenosynovitis, and trigger finger.

The primary objective of the event was to enhance knowledge, awareness and preventing injuries and occupational hazards among patients, security workers, and students. The posters additionally presented information regarding the diverse treatment alternatives accessible for these disorders, underscoring the significance of prompt intervention and the pursuit of medical assistance. The program additionally featured interactive demonstrations of part management in finger amputation by Professor and Head of Department, Dr. Anil K. Bhat, and senior faculty member, Dr. Ashwath Acharya, additionally regarding hand safety measures aimed at promoting hand health and preventing injuries. Furthermore, we responded to inquiries and offered additional instruction into the etiology and risk variables linked to these distressing ailments.

The ISSH Academics activities have kept the members connected to the association by weekly communication through a learning material which has been modified each year to avoid a monotony - over five years, we have had weekly "Sunday Reads"- of the most classic articles in hand surgery followed by the most cited articles in Hand Surgery and then Infographic of the most recent articles and then a video explaining the recent advance articles. This year (2023) we have moved on to a surgical video by an expert ever week-"ISSH- Sunday Watch". Till now we have had 32 surgical videos and many members have expressed their appreciation for this initiative. The surgical video is shared on every Sunday morning via the official mail address and also on the official WhatsApp group. We plan to share 50 videos in this year. The Academic Team is proud to be associated with our President, Dr. Santosh Rath's, dream project-National Capacity Building Program- which is being implemented by ISSH Academic Committee including senior mentors and young active academicians and leaders.



This initiative aims to have a structured teaching at various levels- from the basic to the advanced. The Basic Hand Courses with standardised teaching program are being conducted at various places in India. They aim to provide the basic knowledge of Hand Surgery to the primary responders at their local places including General Surgeons, General Orthopedic Surgeons and the Plastic Surgeons. In an attempt to 'Standardise the Training Program' the Mid-term CME program has been re-designed in such a way that over a period of five years it would cover all the subspeciality topics in Hand Surgery. Assuring that if a trainee has attended five such CMEs, he would be exposed to the whole spectrum of Hand Surgery.



The aim is to standardise the teaching programs of ISSH, to reach to the masses and improve the primary care of hand injuries and basic hand conditions throughout India - in lines with the Presidential Theme for 2023 - Improving Quality and Access.

Another major component of the National Capacity Building Program is a unique initiative to improve the quality and effectiveness of our trainers- "Training The Trainer" (TTT) Program. Twelve ISSH members from all around India have been selected for the first phase of this program and we have plans to conduct this program for the next five consecutive years.



This program will aim to improve the soft skills essential to make impactful presentations and effective communication, and to instill leadership skills. The AO America team of Dr. Chitra Subramaniam, Dr. Chaitanya Mudgal and Dr. Amit Gupta have kindly consented to do the first training program for the ISSH. The TTT program has four weeks of learning modules with assignments followed by two half days in-person program after ISSHCON-2023 at Chandigarh. We all are keenly looking forward to be a part of this unique event.

With lots of exciting activities coming up this year, we have already started planning for more interesting learning activities in the years to come... Stay Tuned !

ISSH Mid-term CME, SKIMS, Srinagar



The ISSH Midterm CME 2023 was organized by the Department of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Sher-I-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (SKIMS), Srinagar on 5th and 6th May 2023 at the SKIMS Auditorium, Srinagar.

The main highlights of the CME included Guest Lectures, Keynote Lectures, Panel Discussions, a Surgical Video Module, a Free Paper Module, an Award Paper Session and a Quiz on Hand Surgery. There was a total of 64 lectures/ oral presentations, one session of surgical videos, and 10 poster presentations. More than fifty hand surgeons from all parts of the country joined as invited faculty in the CME. There were more than 107 in-person registrations representing almost all regions of the nation. The CME was held in a hybrid mode with 20 hand surgeons joining the live show.

The two-day academic deliberations were enjoyed by one and all, making the CME a grand success. The local hospitality as well as the beauty of Kashmir Valley added further flavour to the academic feast.

Manipal Upper Limb Course (MULC)





The first Manipal Upper Limb Course was conducted by the Department of Hand Surgery, KMC Manipal, on March 17, 2023, at the TMA Pai auditorium in Manipal under the dynamic leadership of Prof. Anil K Bhat. Dr Bhaskaranand Kumar, senior hand surgeon from Manipal graced the programme with his vast teaching experience.

The course aimed to provide comprehensive training on upper limb examination. Renowned hand surgeons from around the country were invited as faculty members to share their expertise and insights with the participants. Eminent faculty who serve as examiners for various universities moderated live case presentations by postgraduates from various colleges in and around Manipal. The participants had the opportunity to present, observe, and learn from these live case presentations, gaining valuable practical knowledge.

Additionally, interactive sessions were conducted to enhance the participants' skills in upper limb examination techniques, ensuring a well-rounded learning experience. Seventy-four postgraduates attended the course and presented eight upper limb exam cases. 5th Indo US Hand Surgery Conference 2023





Under the auspices of the Indian Society for Surgery of the Hand and the Karnataka Orthopaedic Association, the Department of Hand Surgery at KMC Manipal organized the 5th Annual Indo-US Hand Surgery Conference under the able leadership of Prof. Anil K Bhat as the local organizing chairman and Dr Chaitanya Mudgal, MGH, Boston as the course coordinator. The conference was held on March 18th and 19th, 2023, at the TMA Pai auditorium, Manipal. The conference aimed to bring together leading experts in the field of hand surgery from both India and the United States to exchange knowledge

and discuss advancements in the field. Renowned surgeons and researchers delivered keynote speeches, conducted workshops, and presented their latest findings, making it a highly informative and interactive event for all attendees. Dr. Chaitanya Mudgal, a renowned hand surgeon from the United States, shared his expertise on the latest techniques in hand reconstruction surgery. Dr. Amit Gupta, an esteemed researcher and clinician from the United States, presented his groundbreaking research on hand injuries and disabilities. There was a separate session on Women in Hand Surgery (WISH), moderated by three national and two international women hand surgeons. Dr. Mukund Thatte, the immediate past president of the ISSH, and Dr. Santhosh Rath, the current president, gave Mudgal orations(The making of the human thumb – the story of evolution) and Kudav orations(Streamlining training for Indian hand surgeons) in which they discussed their experiences with hand surgery and outlined the future paths for young hand surgeons. Thirty-three lectures were delivered on common conditions in the surgery of the upper limb and was attended by 80 participants. The participants had the opportunity to engage in interactive discussions and gain valuable insights from the experts. Overall, the conference was a successful platform for knowledge exchange and networking among hand surgeons.

Obituary: Dr. B. Jagannath Kamath



In Memoriam



Dr. B. Jagannath Kamath, a true 'Saint' in the field of hand surgery

Dr. B. Jagannath Kamath, a renowned figure in the field of hand surgery, made immense contributions to the world of medicine, particularly in the domain of hand surgery.

Early life and career

Dr. Jagannath's journey commenced with a strong academic foundation. He completed his undergraduate and postgraduate studies in orthopaedic surgery at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore, in 1986. His relentless pursuit of excellence and his passion for healing soon led him to the specialized realm of hand surgery when he completed a hand surgery course at Stanley Medical College, Chennai, in 1989. He served in the Department of Orthopaedics at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore, for over three decades until his unfortunate demise on September 28, 2023.

Pioneering techniques

Throughout his career, Dr. Jagannath was widely recognized for his innovative surgical techniques. His ground-breaking work included the development of a simple and cost-effective nerve approximator1, an improvised two-in-one syringe suction drain2, a userfriendly semi-rigid tendon retriever and flexor sheath dilator3, and a flexor tendon simulator4, laser guide for C-arm. Notably, he introduced a straight forward biplanar double Kessler core stretch technique for flexor tendon repair5,. During his final year, he was in the process of developing a biplanar C-arm to optimize operating room efficiency and minimize radiation exposure.

Academic and research achievements

Dr. Jagannath's dedication to academia remained

unwavering. He authored a substantial number of research articles on flaps, including topics such as 'wing flaps,' perforator-based pedicled para-umbilical flaps6, local superficial flaps for plantar ulcers in leprosy7, and perforator-based flap cover from the anterior-lateral compartment of the leg for the treatment of moderatesized traumatic pretibial soft tissue defects8, among others. His contributions not only improved patient outcomes but also established new standards in the field of hand surgery. Even after being diagnosed with a terminal illness, he managed to publish one more article (in press) titled 'The glove hand: an innovative method for effective bedside preoperative flap planning in hand injuries.'9 He actively participated in international conferences, sharing his insights and collaborating with surgeons from diverse backgrounds.

Clinical excellence

One of Dr. Jagannath's defining qualities was his unwavering commitment to clinical excellence. Patients from all walks of life sought his expertise in treating complex hand injuries and deformities. His compassionate care and surgical skill earned him the trust and admiration of both patients and peers alike. He upheld the principles of the Hippocratic oath without discrimination based on income, consistently treating patients at Government Wenlock Hospital, Mangaluru, for over three decades, often employing low-cost innovations.

A true humanitarian

The legacy of Dr. B. Jagannath is immeasurable. He leaves behind a generation of hand surgeons who were fortunate to learn from his wisdom and experience. His dedication to the field continues to inspire young medical professionals, ensuring that his contributions endure. His commitment to education extended to mentoring young surgeons, thereby shaping the future of the discipline. The respect he showed toward his junior surgeons is something most people will never forget. Remarkably, he donated his entire collection of microsurgical instruments to a junior hand surgeon in Mangaluru upon his diagnosis of a terminal illness. He contributed a substantial amount of money to establish an annual 'Fellowship in Hand and Microvascular Surgery' for members of the 'Canara Orthopaedic Society.' This initiative has benefited six orthopaedic surgeons so far, who have since become dedicated 'Hand Surgeons'.

Dreams to carry forward

He aspired to establish an exclusive hand centre dedicated to serving the needs of the people in this region. This specialized hand centre would undoubtedly inspire numerous aspiring surgeons to choose hand and plastic orthopaedic surgery as their specialty. It is now up to his countless admirers and students to realize the dream of Dr. B. Jagannath Kamath.

Dr. B. Jagannath's passing represents a significant loss to the world of hand surgery and the broader medical community. His pioneering work, commitment to excellence, and passion for healing have left an indelible mark on the orthopaedic fraternity. Let us carry forward his legacy by upholding the highest standards of medical practice and education in the field of hand surgery. We pay tribute to this distinguished surgeon who would be remembered as a 'Saint of Hand Surgery'.
