Make your work visible

The main problem as I see it is the need for increased awareness among the public and the peers as to what a hand and micro surgeon does and can do. We can say that a Hand surgeon does all these things, but that campaign will have meaning if only there are sufficiently well trained people who will deliver the goods to the people. We need to do two things. One is to train more hand surgeons who would provide quality care. Second is to attract talent into the specialty. Our association is taking effort to progress on both fronts. ISSH sponsored courses are being conducted. Two candidates have gone through the Robert Acland - S & T International Fellowship. I am sure that experience will help them to emerge as future leaders inspiring others. Each one of us must make it a point to address at least one local doctors meeting and regularly present your work in hospital clinical meetings. It is simple but that will go a long way.

Making Indian Hand Surgery visible on the world

This can be done only by good presentations both in the national and international meetings. It is encouraging to find that the number of Indian registrants is on the increase as seen in the participation both at the Sydney and the Seoul congresses. Next is to publish. Though it is on the increase it has to be more. Further we need to support the Hand Surgery journals. There exists a scheme for the subsidized subscription for the Journal of Hand Surgery (European) but the takers are surprisingly few. Further we have an embarrassingly poor subscription history for the Asian Pacific volume of Hand Surgery. We need to participate in the efforts of our colleagues in the region to strengthen the journal.

I think the need of the hour is to have a greater collaboration between the surgeons and the hand therapists. The relationship has to grow in a healthy way for the benefit of the patients. Therapists from many areas would benefit from the exposure to the advances that have taken place in the field and I do appeal to you to bring them along with you for the 2013 congress.

Minutes of ISSH Executive Committee Meeting in Nashik on 25/11/2010

The ISSH Executive Committee Meeting was held on 25/11/2010 in Nashik. The following members were present

The President ISSH presided over the meeting and the following issues were discussed

- 1. The accounts for the year 2010 was presented by the Treasurer.
- 2. Ethicon Inland traveling fellowship: Funding stopped since 2007 and Dr. Sabapathy was requested to follow-up with the company for funds
- 3. Pending fellowship payments to Dr Ravi Gupta and Dr. Praveen Bharadwaj to be made from ISSH secretary account after ratification by AGM.
- 4. Start one Annual ISSH Inland fellowship Rs.15.000/peryear
- 5. It was resolved to create a corpus of Rs. 2, 50,000 for ISSH inland fellowship and the interest from this to fund the fellowship. Any deficit to be paid from the Secretary account.
- 6. Resolved to have hand therapists (physio & Occupation) as associate members of ISSH

- 7. Acland and S&T fellowship: One application only of Dr Bharat Kadadi. The application was in order, fulfilled all the criteria and was awarded the fellowship for the year 2011.
- 8. Best paper award: Rs. 5000/ to be paid by ISSH. The results to be announced during the valedictory function and the award to be presented then.
- 9. Resolved that Rs. 20052 to be transferred from the ISSH trust funds to adjust the deficit for the Acland & S&T fellowship.
- 10. Dr B Anatharam handed over a cheque of Rs. 25494/ as savings from the combined meeting in Bangalore in 2008.
- 11. Funding for the oration medallion: Interest from the oration corpus inadequate to meet cost of medallion. Deficit to be funded from Secretary Account.
- 12. Election for VP and 2 EC members.
- 13. IFSSH2013:Dr Sabapathy briefed the Seoul meeting;
- 14. Delegate fee:USD900 for surgeons and 450 for therapist
- 15. 10% of therapist fee to IFSHT
- 16. Privileged registration: Rs 20,000/ for 1 year ending 31st December 2011.
- 17. Seed money received from IFSSH for 2013 meeting. This has to be returned to IFSSH 3 weeks before the conference.
- 18. The meeting was adjourned by Dr Chandraprakasam.

Minutes of Annual General Body Meeting of ISSH held on 27th November 2010 in the conference hall of Express Inn Hotel, Nashik

The meeting was presided by ISSH President Dr.T Chandraprakasam. There were 45 members present at the meeting.

Secretary & treasurer of ISSH Dr. Santosh Rath presented his report and accounts for the year 2010. The accounts were passed by the members.

The Secretary also read the ISSH Trustees report and the minutes of the EC.

The Secretary announced the 21 new life membership applications. The applications of Dr Likes Martha,

N.K. Deep, Amitabh Singh, Sanjay Jain, V.S.N Raju, Anil Ramesh Gumasekara, SR Nijemanne, MK Parakrama karunadas, GNS Ekanayaka, Mahesh Mangal, Kalyan Dadireddy, Abhijit Sarkar, Chiman Chode Gunarat, Bhagwan Deshpande, Nabeen Bansal, Pankaj Gujar, Abhijit Wahengaonkar, Bipin Ganggurde, PS Binoy, Oommen V Oommen, Amit Vyas and Gautam Biswas were approved by the Members.

The Secretary announced the ISSH Inland Fellowship of Rs. 15,000/, to be funded by ISSH funds. There will be one fellowship for 2011 and depending on the

finances these will be increased in the following years. Details of application and selection to be uploaded at ISSH web site and ISSH News letter.

The President announced the award of Robert Acland - S&T travelling fellowship to Dr. Bharat Kadadi. The recipient is required to submit one page report to the EC and present at the ISSH annual meeting before being awarded the remaining 50% of the award. Members expressed the need to define the process of selection. It was agreed that the decision of the EC would be final regarding award of both the fellowships.

Dr. Ananthram presented a cheque of Rs.25, 000/ from the ISSH Bangalore meeting and Dr.Vikas Gupta presented a cheque of Rs.59, 371/ from the ISSH Delhi meeting. Members appreciated these contributions from these past organizers. It was agreed by the AGM that ISSH conference organizers must submit audited accounts within one year of the meeting.

Members were requested to subscribe for the European Journal of Hand Surgery at the subsidized rates. The publishers are reluctant to continue their offer of this concession unless the subscription increases.

The Secretary informed that 24 ISSH members attended the IFSSH meeting in Seoul and presented over 50 papers, invited lectures and posters. Dr Sudhir Warrior was invited to make a brief presentation on the meeting, facilities and difficulties faced by the delegates. These issues are to be addressed by the organizing committee of 2013 IFSSH meeting. Dr Raja Sabapathy organizing chairman of the IFSSH meeting presented a detailed report on the progress of the meeting and requested ISSH members to register early and take advantage of the concessional rates.

Dr Ravi Mahajan was awarded the ISSH 2012 meeting at Amritsar.

Dr Anil Bhat, Organizing secretary of 2011 ISSH meeting in Manipal presented on the facilities and arrangements for the meeting to be held from 25-27th of November.

Dr. Ayappan Nair and Dr.P.Ravichandran completed their 2 year term as EC members. The members conveyed thanks to Dr .Ayappan Nair and Dr. Ravichandran for their contribution to ISSH.

Dr. V.S.Patil was elected unanimously as Vice-President for a period of 2 years. Dr.Viswa Prakash gracefully withdrew his nomination to facilitate unanimous elections of Dr. Patil, one of our senior most members.

Dr. Binu Thomas and Dr. Shailesh Gupta were elected as new EC members.

The meeting was adjourned with thanks for the Organizers of the ISSH meeting in Nashik.

Dr Robert Acland – S & T Overseas Travelling Fellowship 2012

The Robert Acland-S&T overseas traveling fellowship is intended for senior ISSH members who have shown a commitment to Hand surgery and are capable of projecting Indian Hand Surgery in an international forum. The ISSH thanks Dr Acland and Mr. Markus Springler of S & T for making it possible. The condition of the award is given below.

Fellowship Guidelines:

- 1. Each year one candidate will be chosen for the Fellowship and it carries an award of Rs. One Lakh
- 2. The awardee must have done considerable work in Hand Surgery and must serve as an ambassador for Indian Hand Surgery.
- 3. The applicant must have been a member of the ISSH for at least 7 years
- 4. He must have attended at least 3 annual meetings of the Indian Society for Surgery of the Hand in the past 7 years.

- 5. The fund could be utilized by the Fellow for attending an International Hand & Microsurgery meeting to present a paper and / or spend a few weeks in a reputed centre with prior concurrence of the Executive Committee of the Indian Society for Surgery of the Hand
- 6. 50 % of the sum would be made available for the candidate before the departure. On completion of the Fellowship, the Fellow must send in a report to the Secretary, ISSH to become eligible for the disbursement of the remaining amount.
- 7. The Overseas Traveling Fellow will make a presentation about his experience in the subsequent annual meeting when the award will be given during the Inaugural Ceremony.
- 8. The selection of the fellow will be done by the Executive Committee of the Indian Society for Surgery of the Hand

Prof R.Venkataswami Oration 2011. 'Super Microsurgery of Nerves'



Dr. Ayemric Lim Senior Consultant, Department of Hand & Reconstructive Surgery and

Chairman, Medical Board, National University Hospital, Singapore

Associate Professor, Department of Orthopedic Surgery, National University of Singapore (NUS)

A/Prof Lim completed his medical training at the National University of Singapore in 1990. He obtained his FRCS (Glasgow) in General Surgery in 1995 and went on to complete his advanced Fellowship training in Hand surgery in France, Bordeaux and Nancy, in 2000.

A/Prof Lim's research interests include free flaps, nerve and brachial plexus surgery as well as tendon transfers. His research on the intra-muscular innervation of the muscles of the forearm has led to pioneering clinical work in the field of tendon transfers, where a single muscle unit was split and used for two separate tendon transfers. Such techniques are especially useful for patients with severe crush or nerve injuries to the forearm. In addition, A/Prof Lim has authored numerous research papers in international journals, written two book chapters and participated as an invited speaker at local and international meetings.

IFSHT Program Planning for the Combined IFSSH / IFSHT Triennial Meeting in New Delhi, March 2013.

It is hard to believe that we are only 15 months away from this exciting event. As the co-chairs of the IFSHT International program committee for the IFSHT New Delhi meeting in March of 2013 we are pleased to have had the opportunity to working collaboratively with Drs Raja Sabapathy and Santosh Rath over the past few months in the planning of this meeting. Of course, integral for the planning of such an event is utilizing the experience and expertise provided by our committee members, who are Roma Bhopal (UK), Cecilia Li (Hong Kong), Rosemary Prosser (Australia), Birgitta Rosén (Sweden), Stacey Doyon (USA), Sue Michlovitz (USA), Terri Skirven (USA) and Hemant Nandgaonkar (India) the current IFSHT Delegate for India who is acting as the incountry liaison on this committee.

To date we have be able to define the overall program structure and likely themes and faculty for the meeting; with the plan to have the final program plan and themes in place by January 2012. The structure for the therapist programming will be larger plenary sessions in the morning with presentations and panel discussions on selected topics, with the afternoons having more focused concurrent smaller group interactive sessions and 'hands on' workshops. Scientific papers will be integrated into the sessions and there will also be interactive poster sessions during the breaks with

guided tours and informal discussions of the posters with the authors present.

In our travels to various countries over the past few months, it is very clear that many therapists from all over the world are looking forward to coming to New Delhi in March of 2013 for the joint IFSSH / IFSHT triennial meeting. We are sure this meeting will prove to be an exceptional shared learning experience for hand surgeons and hand therapist alike, but equally important, this will be a unique opportunity for us all to come and experience the wonderful hospitality offered by ISSH in a culturally diverse and historical country such as India . . . this will definitely be a meeting to remember.

OBITUARY

Professor Ambrose James Selvapandian (Dr A J Selvapandian or Prof AJS as he was called) passed away on the morning of 01 April 2011. He was 88 years old at the time. Dr Selvapandian was the founder member of ISSH.

He was a colleague of Dr Paul Brand since joining CMC Vellore in 1951. He was engaged in Dr Brand's pioneering work of reconstructive surgery and rehabilitation of the leprosy disabled at CMC Hospital Vellore and several centers in the country. He took over as Professor & Head of the Department of Orthopedics and Leprosy Reconstructive surgery after Dr Paul Brand left to NHDC Carville, Louisiana, and USA. Prof AJS retired from CMC Vellore on 14 February 1982 after service of 31 years. He was awarded the prestigious BC Roy award.

Besides his engagement with trauma, infections and spine in general Orthopedics he was avidly interested in Hand surgery, largely in reconstructive surgery for leprosy disabled and post poliomyelitis residual deformity. He conducted Annual Refresher courses in Leprosy Reconstructive surgery at CMCH Vellore for medical graduates and technical staff. He pioneered the Mobile Surgical Programme wherein he periodically took teams to far lying and remote centers and performed reconstructive surgery. He was a Member of the Working group on Poliomyelitis deformity and correction set up by the DHGS. He was appointed by WHO in the late 1970's and visited several Institutions in India, to teach and demonstrate surgery and rehabilitation. He had a healthy respect for all his contemporaries in India during his time at CMC Vellore. The earliest orthopedic postgraduates of CMC Vellore remember him for his patience, skill, and compassion towards patients besides his common sense approach to the most complex problems of that time.

The ISSH and IOA has lost a remarkable man and a highly regarded surgeon in the country who pioneered and propagated reconstructive surgery and rehabilitation.
